Ways to Reduce YOUR Plastic Use

When shopping for recipe ingredients, remember to bring reusable shopping bags to reduce your plastic use. **All ingredients listed in this guide are available in glass, metal, cardboard, paper or recyclable plastic packaging.**

Laundry Detergent

Ingredients:

- 1 cup grated soap (this is a great use for small slivers of leftover soap or freebie hotel soap)
- ½ cup washing soda
- ½ cup baking soda
- 1 cup borax or kosher salt.

Equipment:

- Food processor or blender

Directions: 1. Grate soap in a food processor or blender until you have 1 cup's worth. 2. Mix ingredients together and store in a reusable jar. Use 3-6 tablespoons per load depending on size of the load.



Liquid Castile Soap¹

Ingredients:

- 5 oz castile soap bar
- ½ gallon of filtered water

Equipment:

- Food processor or blender

Directions: 1. Grate castile soap bar in a food processor or blender into tiny flakes. 2. Boil ½ gallon of filtered water and reduce heat slightly so that water
